SUMMARY ANNUAL REPORT

For

Ironworkers District Council of the Pacific Northwest Field Ironworkers Annuity Trust Fund

We furnish this report to inform you of the financial activity of the **Ironworkers District Council of the Pacific Northwest Field Ironworkers Annuity Trust Fund** and to assist you in better understanding how your Plan operates.

We caution you that not every participant receives benefits under all of these plans.

This is a summary of the annual report for Ironworkers District Council of the Pacific Northwest Field Ironworkers Annuity Trust Fund, EIN 91-1342114, Plan No. 002, for period July 01, 2015 through June 30, 2016. The annual report has been filed with the Employee Benefits Security Administration, U.S. Department of Labor, as required under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

BASIC FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Benefits under the plan are provided by a trust fund. Plan expenses were \$16,057,267. These expenses included \$1,431,735 in administrative expenses, and \$14,625,532 in benefits paid to participants and beneficiaries. A total of 5,812 persons were participants in or beneficiaries of the plan at the end of the plan year, although not all of these persons had yet earned the right to receive benefits.

The value of plan assets, after subtracting liabilities of the plan, was \$250,806,138 as of June 30, 2016, compared to \$247,192,463 as of July 01, 2015. During the plan year, the plan experienced an increase in its net assets of \$3,613,675. This increase includes unrealized appreciation and depreciation in the value of plan assets; that is, the difference between the value of the plan's assets at the end of the year and the value of the assets at the beginning of the year or the cost of assets acquired during the year. The plan had total income of \$19,670,942, including employer contributions of \$23,420,847, realized gains of \$4,238,193 from the sale of assets, earnings from investments of (\$8,152,214), and other income of \$164,116.

You have the right to receive a copy of the full annual report, or any part thereof, on request. The items listed below are included in that report:

- An accountant's report;
- Financial information;
- Information on payments to service providers;
- Assets held for investment;
- Loans or other obligations in default or classified as uncollectible;
- Transactions in excess of 5% of the plan assets;
- Information regarding any common or collective trusts, pooled separate accounts, master trusts or 103-12 investment entities in which the plan participates;

You also have the right to receive from the plan administrator, on request and at no charge, a statement of the assets and liabilities of the plan and accompanying notes, or a statement of income and expenses of the plan and accompanying notes, or both. If you request a copy of the full annual report from the plan administrator, these two statements and accompanying notes will be included as part of that report. The charge to cover copying costs given above does not include a charge for the copying of these portions of the report because these portions are furnished without charge.

You also have the legally protected right to examine the annual report at the main office of the plan (Board of Trustees - Pacific Northwest Field Ironworkers Annuity Trust Fund, 7525 SE 24th Street, Suite 200, Mercer Island, WA 98040) and at the U.S. Department of Labor in Washington, D.C., or to obtain a copy from the U.S. Department of Labor upon payment of copying costs.
